Born and raised in Ohio, Ray Hauserman attended Washington and Jefferson College, became a Christian pacifist, and drove a Red Cross ambulance as part of the American Field Service in Burma during World War II. Seeking answers to the horrors of war that were part of his life on the battlefield for nearly two years, Ray met Thakur in 1945, became a member of Thakur's community, Satsang, and lived with him for the next 25 years. After Thakur's samadhi in 1969, Ray drove a taxi in New York City supporting a Satsang group where he demonstrated the universality of Thakur's teachings to everyone from drug abusers to spiritual seekers.
